

## PUBLIC NOTICE No. 01/2018

### Call for Applications for the National Program of Post-Doctorate (PNPD/CAPES)

### Selection process for the Graduate Program in Psychology - 2018

The Graduate Program in Psychology of the Federal University of Juiz de Fora (Brazil) makes public the opening of applications for the selection process for a scholarship of the National Program of Post-Doctorate (PNPD/CAPES). See <http://www.capes.gov.br/bolsas/bolsas-no-pais/pnpd-capes> for details.

#### 1. On the Scholarship:

- 1.1. One scholarship from the PNPD/CAPES Program will be granted.
- 1.2. The duration of the scholarship is 12 months.

#### 2. On the Submission of the Application:

2.1. All applicants must fulfill the requirements of the Article 5 of the National Program of Post-Doctorate's specific regulation. Applicants must check the application rules at CAPES' website <http://www.capes.gov.br/bolsas/bolsas-no-pais/pnpd-capes>.

2.2. Applications must be submitted until June 8, 2018 by email sent to [mestrado.psicologia@ufjf.edu.br](mailto:mestrado.psicologia@ufjf.edu.br). The subject field must read "application PNPD 2018".

2.3. The following documents must be sent in PDF files attached to the application email:

- a) a formal letter requiring the application to be submitted to the selection process and informing the applicant's complete name, nationality, phone number, email and complete address;
- b) a copy of a government-issued photo identification document (ID);
- c) a 12-month work schedule specifying the intended supervisor, the research project to be developed, research and teaching activities, a time schedule for all activities and the productions to be achieved (publication, participation in academic events, etc.);
- d) a Lattes CV (for Brazilians); in case of foreign applicants, please fill in the CV form presented below in the Appendix 01 to this notice (Public Edict no. 86 of July 3, 2013).
- e) a formal declaration of the veracity of all information given in the email and in all documents mentioned above. Applicants must declare that documental proof of all information given can be presented if required. They must also declare to be aware of, and in agreement with, the fact that in absence of this documental proof immediate exclusion from the selection process may follow, in addition to other applicable legal measures.

2.4. The accepted submissions will be informed on the Graduate Program of Psychology's website in June 12, 2018.

#### 3. On the Selection Process:

3.1. The selection process will consist of the following steps. 1) Assessment of the work schedule presented by the applicant (possible results are approved / non-approved; approved work schedules are worth 20 points). 2) Assessment of the degree of internationalization of the applicant's scientific production (maximum 30 points). 3) Assessment of the applicant's curriculum vitae (maximum 50 points).

3.2. Assessment of the work schedule takes into account the suitability of the research project and the research activities proposed, including the intended supervisor, scientific production, internationalization, methodological aspects, and viability, among others, and undergraduate and graduate teaching activities as well. Inadequacy of the activities proposed in the research project to the field of expertise and research interests of the intended supervisor may result in elimination. Approved work schedules are automatically worth 20 points in the final grade.

3.3. Assessment of the degree of internalization is of classificatory nature and will be based on the applicant's formal education (M.A., Ph.D. and/or post-doctorate abroad) and intellectual production (articles, book chapters and books) published in non-Portuguese languages from 2015 to 2018.

3.3.1. Formal education is evaluated as follows: 100 points for full Ph.D. abroad (non-cumulative to other Ph.Ds.); 25 points for post-doctorate abroad; and 20 points for research time abroad during Ph.D. ("sandwich" Ph.D.; non-cumulative to other Ph.Ds.).

3.3.2. Articles, book chapters and books published in any language other than Portuguese are evaluated according to CAPES' criteria for the research field of Psychology (<http://www.capes.gov.br/component/content/article/44-avaliacao/4681psicologia>). In case of articles, book chapters and books not yet evaluated by CAPES, the following criteria apply: 100 points for book; 30 points for book chapter (chapters in the same book cannot exceed 90 points); 100 points for articles in journals with H Index (Googles Scholar) above 30; 85 points for articles in journals with H Index between 20 and 30; 70 points for articles in journals with H Index between 10 and 19; 55 points for articles with H Index between 1 and 9; articles in journals with H Index below 1 do not qualify for evaluation.

3.3.3. Only published works are to be considered.

3.3.4. At any time during the selection process or after, the selection committee can require copies or other kinds of proof of the publications described. Non-compliance with the requirement will entail immediate exclusion from the process, in addition to other applicable legal measures.

3.3.5. 30 points are to be given to the applicant with greater degree of internationalization, according to the criteria specified above. Points to be given to the remaining applicants are to be calculated by rule of three.

3.4 CV evaluation is of classificatory nature and exclusively based on the applicant's publications (articles, book chapters and books) from 2015 to 2018. These are to be evaluated according to CAPES' criteria for the research field of Psychology (<http://www.capes.gov.br/component/content/article/44-avaliacao/4681psicologia>). In case of articles, book chapters and books not yet evaluated by CAPES, the following criteria apply: 100 points for book; 30 points for book chapter (chapters in the same book cannot exceed 90 points); 100 points for articles in journals with H Index (Googles Scholar) above 30; 85 points for articles in journals with H Index between 20 and 30; 70 points for articles in journals with H Index between 10 and 19; 55 points for articles with H Index between 1 and 9; articles in journals with H Index below 1 do not qualify for evaluation.

3.4.1. Only published works are to be considered.

3.4.2. At any time during the selection process or after, the selection committee can require copies or other kinds of proof of the publications described. Non-compliance with the requirement will entail immediate exclusion from the process, in addition to other applicable legal measures.

3.4.3. 50 points are to be given to the best evaluated CV, according to the criteria specified above. Points to be given to the remaining CVs are to be calculated by rule of three.

Further remarks:

a) The applicant with the best general final grade – including work schedule, internationalization and CV – will be granted the scholarship.

b) In case of two equal final grades, the applicant with the best performance in internationalization will be granted the scholarship. If equality persists, the applicant with the best CV will be granted the scholarship. If equality still persists, the older applicant will be granted the scholarship.

c) The final result of the selection process is to be published on the Graduate Program in Psychology's website on June 15, 2018.
